

SEAS MONMOUTH
SEASON PASS POLICIES & PROCEDURES

1. The SEAS Monmouth Season Pass policies pertain to the use of season passes to share in the cost of operating SEAS Monmouth's boats.
2. Season passes enable the holder to reserve a boat at no additional donation.
3. Season passes can be obtained by any SEAS members whose current membership dues are paid. Members do not have to be skippers to obtain season passes. The suggested donations for the season passes, as well as any early season special offers will be published on the SEAS Monmouth website. Ordering forms for season passes are also on the website.
4. There are currently three types of season passes:
 - a The "All Boat" season pass entitles the holder to make reservations for the Catalina, the Rhodes, or the daysailers.
 - b The "Rhodes" boat season pass entitles the holder to make reservations for the Rhodes or the daysailers.
 - c The 'Daysailer' boat season pass entitles the holder to make reservations for the daysailers.

Note that SEAS Monmouth also offers Rhodes and Catalina keelboat "crew passes", which entitle the holder to a specified number of "rides" on the respective keelboats obtained at a discount. For information about these passes visit <https://sailseas.com/Monmouth/passes.htm>

5. The use of the boats by season pass holders must be scheduled with the appropriate Reservations Coordinator. "Scheduled" means that the start and stop times were not just requested, but that they were approved by the Reservations Coordinator. Requests and confirmation can be via email or telephone to the Reservations Coordinator. Holidays have no special significance for the use of season passes; they are treated as any other weekday or weekend day, depending on their dates.
6. Season pass holders are subject to all Boat Usage Policies. The Season Pass does not grant the holder any special privileges – it is a convenient means of cost sharing.
7. A season pass does not entitle the holder to the use of boats during scheduled group sailing activities (e.g., Tuesday and Thursday night sails, raft-ups, etc.). The scheduling of participants for these activities is under the control of the activity organizer. However, if a club event does not fill the boat (at least 4 passengers plus the skipper), the season pass holder is entitled to attend at no additional donation, providing he or she has submitted the request to the activity organizer.
8. Season passes can be offered to other SEAS chapter members at the same donation as Monmouth SEAS members, and subject to the same policies and rules as Monmouth SEAS members.
9. Failure to follow the above rules and policies may result in the revocation of the season pass at the discretion of the responsible boat Committee, with possible consultation with the SEAS Monmouth Executive Board.
10. The season passes are non-transferable, i.e., someone other than the season pass holder may not use it to reserve and/or sail the boat. This means that the pass holder must make the reservation, and actually be present whenever the boat is used. The pass holder is a designated individual, not a married couple, a family, a club, or any other group.
